

It was a mammoth job categorising and labelling up the books for Accelerated reader – my thanks to all the staff and volunteers involved. ## **Governors' Update**

The Governing Board met on 31 January with a focus on the School Improvement Plan. Every school, nationwide, must have a school improvement plan to define how the school intends to progress at a detailed level. Our core priorities this year are around expanding the reading culture, to continue to refine and embed "Mastery in Mathematics' and to enhance the effectiveness of the curriculum. I am very pleased to be able to report we are making solid progress in each of these areas.

At the board meeting we also:

- Reviewed the phonics action plan and the steps planned to build on our status of meeting the national standards.
- Reviewed our budget forecast which continues to be positive but will need careful management to ensure it remains healthy given increased cost pressures in many areas.
- Reviewed and agreed 7 new and updated policies for adoption by the school including Accessibility, Equality, Inclusion and Diversity and Medical Conditions.

## **School Attendance**

Many thanks once again for all the efforts you are all making to improve our school attendance. Over the last half term our attendance statistics have remained consistent at just a smidge under 96% - our goal is 97% in line with national targets...just a little bit further to go...

School attendance is one of the most important indicators of success for both pupils and the school. Good attendance results in success across a range of outcomes, which are key to a child's overall development. The importance of school attendance has been highlighted by the Department for Education in their recent campaign: 'Moments Matter, Attendance Counts'.
