

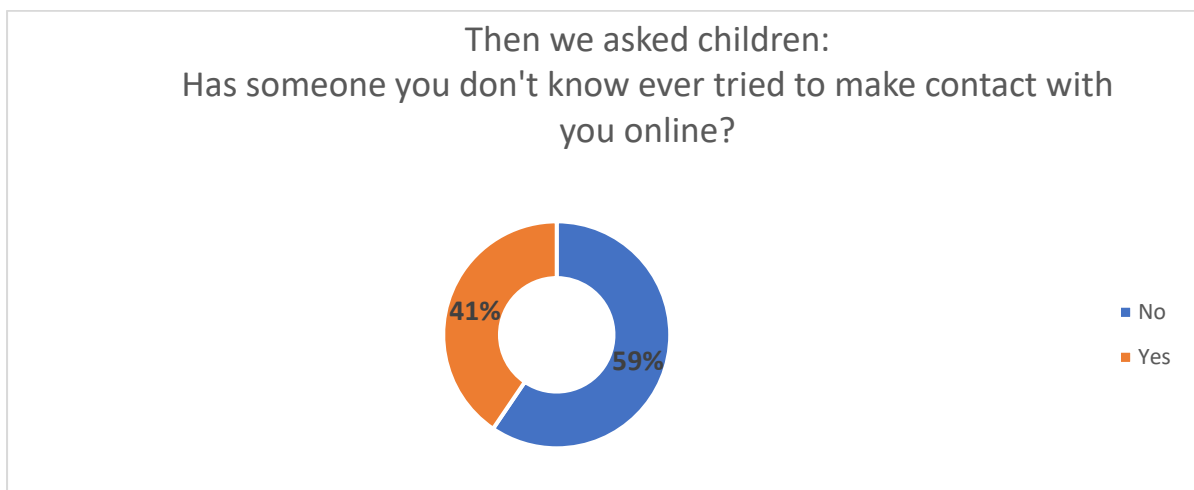
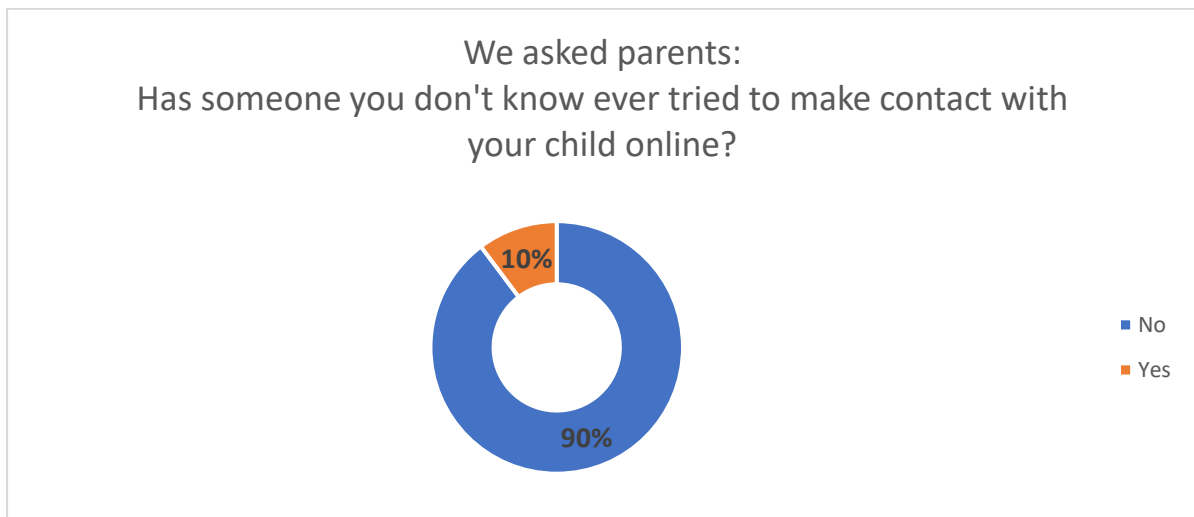


The online world needs heroes...

Dear Parents and Carers,

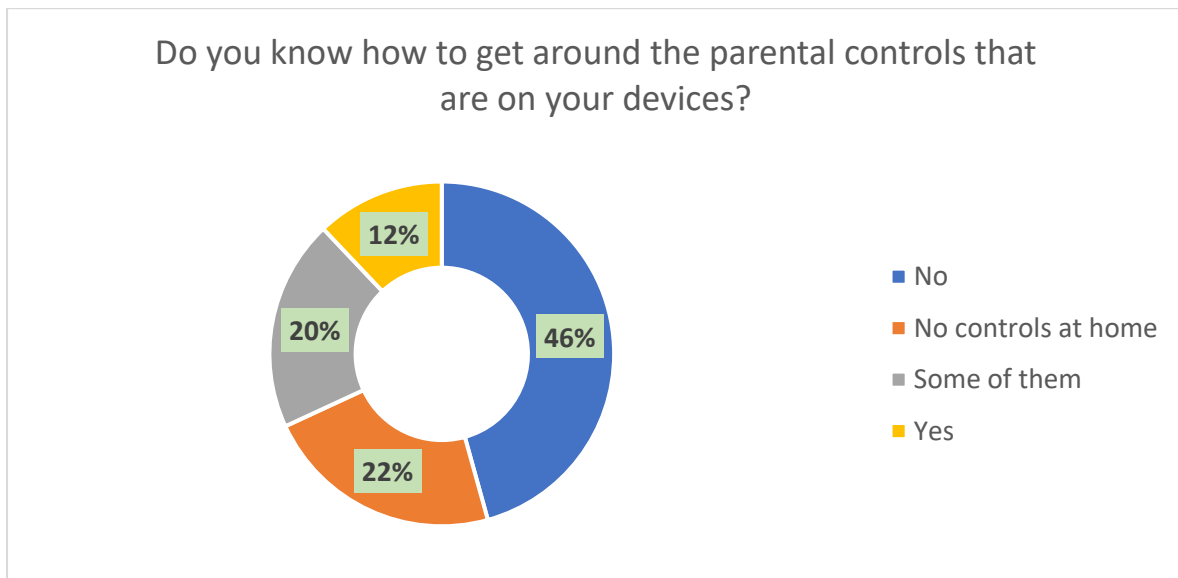
Our school is dedicated to ensuring that our pupils have the knowledge and skills to stay safe online. We also know that parents and carers sometimes feel a little left behind and unsure of what help and support is out there to help them.

We have invited Traci Good and Anna Heyes, who specialise in Online Safety to deliver a workshop to parents about the amazing opportunities that the internet has to offer our children and also a look at some of the risks that our children may face and how to deal with them if they happen. Traci has recently completed a survey of the online habits of 12,000 children and 1,800 parents:



Traci says “Firstly, and most importantly this isn’t a session to tell you how to parent your children! As parents and carers we need to understand some of the risks our children face and how we can support them, and where we can get help ourselves if we need it.

54% of primary aged children in the Derbyshire area have told us that they know how to get around some or all of the parental controls we have put in place, so when they get to secondary school it can occasionally feel like we are on the backfoot, and we could do with a few hints and tips to stay on top of online safety.



I can almost promise that you will learn something new so please join us.
