Differentiation:

Developing Questions to support using basic adverbs of place, including: here, there, nowhere and everywhere. Includes only one verb and adverb per sentence.

Expected Questions to support using adverbs of place, including: out, in, above, below, inside, outside, into. Includes more than one verb or more than one adverb per sentence and some use of adjectives and conjunctions.

Greater Depth Questions to support using adverbs of place in sentences which include adjectives, conjunctions, a range of determiners and adverbs to express time and manner. Adverbs of place include: around, down, up, on, under, over. Includes more than one verb and adverb per sentence.
