Greater Depth Select appropriate verbs and adverbs of place to complete sentences with more than one verb and adverb. Some use of adjectives, conjunctions, a range of determiners and adverbs to express time and manner.

Questions 3, 6 and 9 (Application and Reasoning)

Developing Rewrite the sentence, replacing the adverb of place so that the meaning of the sentence is changed. Given sentence includes one verb and adverb of place.

Expected Rewrite the sentence, replacing the adverb of place so that the meaning of the sentence remains the same. Given sentence includes more than one verb or adverb of place, and some use of adjectives and conjunctions.

Greater Depth Rewrite the sentence, replacing the adverb of place so that the meaning of the sentence remains the same. Given sentence includes more than one verb and adverb of place. Some use of adjectives, conjunctions, a range of determiners and adverbs to express time and manner.

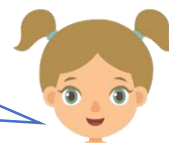

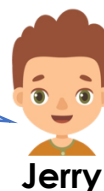
